Council President Scritchfield called the Regular meeting of the Wrightsville Borough governing body to order at 7:02pm and led the salute to the American Flag.

PATRONS:

- Jim Markley:  
Mr. Markley who resides in the 700 block of Locust St. expressed his dislike to the alley way not being paved by his home. He presented council with photographs of the area for them to view. Mr. Markley also expressed that the alley ways were not clear and accessible during the snow storm.
- Ed Sipes:  
Mr. Sipes presented Borough Council with updates from the Stormwater Consortium meeting that he recently attended. Mr. Sipes relayed to those in attendance that the Recreation Commission will be working on the field for T-ball practice to begin, Senior Center hosted a Spaghetti Dinner on February 27, 2016 which raised \$1600.00 and Historic Wrightsville will be having an Olde Town Night on March 12, 2016 at 6p.m.
- Blake Staker:  
Mr. Staker was in attendance to answer any questions that Borough Council may have concerning the proposed Fire Siren Signal.  
Members of the Wrightsville Fire Department were in attendance to indicate to council their likes and dislikes to the proposal.  
Borough Council President Scritchfield relayed to those in attendance the proposal would be discussed at the Planning Meeting on March 21, 2016.
- Mel McDonald:  
Mrs. Mc Donald relayed to those in attendance that she supports the fire sirens that are activated, especially in an emergency situation. Mrs. McDonald asked the question of council :” How much money do you make”, President Scritchfield answered her question.

Mrs. McDonald stated to council that the stones/sidewalk at the corner of Front Street/Hellam Street were still in shambles. Engineer Klindedinst stated to those in attendance that he would visit the location and report back to council.

- Keith Miller/Corina Mann:

Mr. Miller from Hellam Township Recreation discussed with Borough Council a \$10,000.00 grant from DCNR that he is working with local neighboring municipalities on with the hopes that those municipalities will work together to apply for the DCNR grant for enrichment of local recreation within the Eastern York School District. The municipalities that would be a partnership would include: Yorkana, Lower Windsor, Hellam Borough/Township included in Wrightsville Borough.
