



**YARD WASTE PICK-UP**

Yard waste pick-up will begin on March 10, 2014. Yard waste must be placed into brown biodegradable bags or trash cans filled with ONLY yard waste. Yard waste bags can be purchased at the Borough Office for \$0.46 per bag. Any yard waste that cannot be put into bags/cans may be bundled in no more than 4' length bundles and placed by the curb.

*Yard waste placed into plastic bags will NOT be picked up.*

**STREET SWEEPING**

Keep an eye out for NO PARKING signs on your street on the days of street sweeping. Residents are respectfully asked to refrain from sweeping gravel/stones into piles as it makes it more difficult to be picked up by the street sweeper.

**NOTICE**

*From the York County Planning Commission:*

York County is facing another round of flood map updates from FEMA. Our last round of National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Map updates were adopted on September 25, 2009. The new maps are scheduled to take effect in early 2015. The new maps were updated using new elevation data and analysis on over 80 miles of area streams. The results of the new data may remove certain property owners from needing flood insurance, but will require other property owners to purchase flood insurance. Municipalities will also need to update their floodplain ordinances to be in compliance with the new maps.



# PERMITS

Permit applications and other useful forms are located in the Borough lobby and also on the Borough website: [www.wrightsvilleborough.com](http://www.wrightsvilleborough.com). Permit fees do not need to be paid until permit is approved and picked up.

## PARK PAVILION RESERVATION:

- FREE
- Include # of tables needed when submitting reservation
- Borough Streets Department will set up tables prior to event

## YARD SALE PERMIT:

- FREE for first 3 in a calendar year (\$25 each after that)
- Apply for permit 1 week before yard sale to be sure there is plenty of time
- Permit must be on hand during yard sale (No need to display it)

## SOLICITATION (Transient Business Permit):

- \$50 Fee (Good for 1 month)
- All 10 checklist items must be included on permit application
- Permit approval does not happen the same day

## ENTERTAINMENT PERMIT:

- \$50 Fee
- Will you require any street closures? Be sure to submit a street closure request with your permit application.
- Borough Mayor and Secretary will need to approve



## ZONING & BUILDING PERMITS

All zoning and building (UCC) permit paperwork will now be handled at the Borough Office. Payment for both will also be collected at the Borough. If your project requires both a zoning and a UCC permit, you will need to pay for your permits with 2 separate checks. *Please make zoning permit checks payable to Wrightsville Borough and UCC permit checks payable to Code Administrators, Inc.*

### Do I need a permit?

It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, move, improve, remove, convert or demolish any building/structure without a permit.

### Why do I need a permit?

By obtaining a permit, you will protect the outcome and investment value of your construction project and be able to guard against a lawsuit or injury. Permits are very beneficial to you and our community. By working with the Borough, you will benefit from their knowledge of building codes to ensure your construction project is built right, will be safe, and will last.

# EFFECTIVE STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

## ADOPT-A-STORM DRAIN

It is very important that we work together to keep our storm drains working at 100% capacity at all times. Leaves, grass clippings, trash, branches, etc. can cause blockage which may result in dangerous street flooding if a storm hits.

**Please report any damaged or blocked storm drain inlets right away by calling the Streets Department at 252-4559.**

## THE EFFECTS OF POLLUTION

Polluted stormwater runoff can have many adverse effects on plants, fish, animals and people.

➤ **Sediment** can cloud the water and make it difficult or impossible for aquatic plants to grow. Sediment also can destroy aquatic habitats.

➤ **Excess nutrients** can cause algae blooms. When algae die, they sink to the bottom and decompose in a process that removes oxygen from the water. Fish and other aquatic organisms can't exist in water with low dissolved oxygen levels.

➤ **Bacteria and other pathogens** can wash into swimming areas and create health hazards, often making beach closures necessary.

➤ **Debris** - plastic bags, six-pack rings, bottles, and cigarette butts that are washed into water bodies can choke, suffocate, or disable aquatic life like ducks, fish, turtles, and birds.

➤ **Household hazardous wastes** like insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, used motor oil, and other auto fluids can poison aquatic life. Land animals and people can become sick from eating diseased fish and shellfish or ingesting polluted water.


## TIPS TO HELP KEEP OUR WATERWAYS CLEAN AND HEALTHY:

#### **DO YOU HAVE AN UNUSUALLY HIGH WATER BILL?**



You may be unaware of a leaking faucet or running toilet. To check for a possible leak, turn off everything in your home and then go out and watch your water meter. Your meter will only move if water is flowing through it. If your meter is moving, it means you have a leak somewhere in your home. Be sure to get the leak fixed as quickly as possible to keep your bill from getting too high.



# RECYCLING

## LARGE ITEM TICKETS

If you have a large item you would like to put out with the trash, you must purchase a Large Item Ticket from the Borough office. Item and pricing lists are available online and in the lobby of the Borough office. **Payment must be in the form of a check or money order payable to WBMA.** Large item pickup day is every Friday.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Large item ticket coupons printed in past newsletters are no longer valid. This practice was discontinued approximately 3 years ago due to misuse.

- Aluminum containers
- Glass containers
- Natural and pigmented plastic narrow-neck containers
- Ferrous (iron/steel/tin) cans
- Newsprint – Do not put in plastic bags!
- Construction paper, craft paper, cereal boxes, shoe boxes or similar
- Printer paper, computer paper, copy paper
- Junk mail, magazines, catalogs, phone books
- Small corrugated cardboard that fits into residential curbside recycling bin

# SPRING FIRE SAFETY TIPS



- ❏ Fill the tanks of lawn mowers, motorbikes and power saws only when the motor is cool and not when in an enclosed area.
- ❏ Store gasoline in an approved safety can and in a cool area away from the house in a detached garage or shed.
- ❏ Dispose of old cans of paint, paint thinners, and accumulated newspapers in the proper manner.
- ❏ Change the batteries in all detectors (smoke & carbon monoxide) every year. The actual detector (smoke & carbon monoxide) should be replaced every 10 years.
- ❏ Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to ensure they are working properly.
- ❏ Conduct a family fire drill. Review and practice your family escape plan.
- ❏ Barbeque gas grills (including gas hoses) and propane tanks should be inspected before use.
- ❏ Fire is NOT the way to get rid of yard waste. The burning of leaves and any general yard waste is not permitted within the Borough of Wrightsville.
