PART 1

OPEN BURNING

§101. DEFINITIONS.

As used in this Part, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

BOROUGH - Borough of Wrightsville.

FURNACE - any enclosed device specifically designed for burning any material for the production of heat.

OPEN FIRE - a fire in which any material is burned in the open or in a receptacle other than a furnace.

PERSON - any individual, partnership, association, corporation, department, bureau, agency or other legal entity.

§102. REGULATIONS.

Within the Borough limits, no person shall:

- A. Ignite or feed an open fire in any public or private place outside any building.
- B. Cause, suffer, allow or permit the maintenance of any open fire on any property under his control outside of any building.

§103. EXCEPTIONS.

Open fire fires may be set in the performance of an official duty of any public officer if the fire is necessary for the prevention of a fire hazard which cannot be abated by other means or the protection of public health. Borough Council may also authorize open fires if done under the supervision of Wrightsville Steam Fire Engine and Hose Company No. 1.

§104. PENALTIES.

FIRE PREVENTION AND FIRE PROTECTION

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part shall be, upon conviction thereof, sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days.
