Solicitor Nahass relayed to members of council that he has reviewed information provided to him in reference to a letter that has been drafted by Hellam Township Solicitor Leber to send to Lower Windsor Township, East Prospect Borough and Yorkana Borough to possibly obtain a remedy to assist Canadochly Ambulance services from being out of order and therefore requiring assistance from Susquehanna Valley EMS Services outside of their first due. Hellam Township, Wrightsville Borough and Hellam Borough will continue to work with their solicitors to draft a letter to be sent to the PA Department of Health and the Emergency Health Services Federation that outlines a need to remedy the situation with Canadochly Ambulance.

Councilman Gromling made a motion to approve the letter drafted by Hellam Township Solicitor to be sent to Lower Windsor Township, East Prospect Borough and Yorkana Borough. Councilman McDonald seconded the motion. All in favor. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.
