Council President White called the Regular Meeting of the Wrightsville Borough governing body to order at 6:32pm and led the salute to the American Flag.

PATRONS:

Mel McDonald:

Mrs. McDonald told council members that anyone that speaks out of time allotted for public comment better be treated like she was at the past council meeting.

Mrs. McDonald stated she contacted 13 different townships/borough and everyone that attends their public meetings are required to wear face coverings and believes anyone that attends meeting in Wrightsville should have to wear face coverings including and most importantly council members.

Ronnie Ramone:

Mr. Ramone introduced himself to members of council and those in attendance as the Program Director for Fun 101.3. Mr. Ramone highlighted an event that has been held in Lititz Park and Lancaster Airport in the past commonly known as "Food Truck Frenzy". Mr. Ramone noted "we like the nightlife is growing by leaps and bounds here and we think that this event could bring more people into the town". Mr. Ramone asked for council's permission to host this family fun event at Riverfront Park this year. Council stated that have no reservations to the event being held in Wrightsville.

ACTION ITEMS:

Vice President Smith made a motion to ratify the approval of Change Order No. 4 for the Green Infrastructure Plan Project No. 2 with MacMor Construction, LLC in the add amount of \$2,511 for accessories for the restroom and credit for excavation. The new contract amount is \$613,439.47. Councilman Bair seconded the motion. All in favor. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

Councilman Bair made a motion to approve MacMor Construction, LLC Application for Payment No. 4 for \$125,569.55 for work completed as of 4/21/21 at Riverfront Park Green

Infrastructure Plan Project. Vice President Smith seconded the motion. All in favor. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

Councilman Bair made a motion to close N. Front St. from Hellam St. to Locust St. for May Street Fair events being held at the Burning Bridge Tavern. Councilman Gromling seconded the motion. Councilman McDonald was opposed to the motion. Motion passed with a 5-1 vote.

Councilman Gromling made a motion to approve Recreation/Entertainment Permit for town yard sale hosted by Historic Wrightsville Inc. at Hope United Methodist Church on Saturday, June 5, 2021 from 8am-3pm. Vice President Smith seconded the motion. All in favor. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.

Vice President Smith made a motion to approve Resolution 2021-3, a resolution of the council of Wrightsville, York County, Pennsylvania, authorizing a Tax and Revenue Anticipation Note (TRAN) pending certification of revenue certificate. Councilman Bair seconded the motion. All in favor. The motion carried with a unanimous vote.
