STREET SWEEPING IS AROUND THE CORNER!



Keep an eye out for **NO PARKING** signs on your street on the days of street sweeping. Residents are respectfully asked to refrain from sweeping gravel/stones into piles as it makes it more difficult to be picked up by the street sweeper.

TREES, GRASS AND WEEDS

WB-IPMC – Chapter 3, Section 302.4 All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from excessive weed or plant growth. Weeds are defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided; however, this term shall not include cultivated flowers and gardens





SOLID WASTE

Refuse containers are to be placed at the curb no earlier than the day before collection and must be removed by the end of the day of collection. Refuse containers must be leak-proof, insect/rodent-proof and equipped with tight-fitting lids.

In accordance with Chapter 6, Part 3, §307 of the Code of Ordinances, remember to always clean up after your dog to avoid creating an animal nuisance. Additionally, Chapter 2, Part 1, §102 states that allowing your cats/dogs to run at large within the Borough is prohibited.

WITH SPRING & SUMMER AROUND THE CORNER, PLEASE REMEMBER THAT IT IS A VIOLATION OF BOROUGH ORDINANCES TO:

- Have grass growing over 6" inches or an accumulation of weeds
- Conduct open burning
- Have an accumulation of bulky rubbish on any property, such as excess trash, discarded furniture, large household appliances such as refrigerators, washing machines, bathtubs, sinks, toilets, etc.



Just a few things from the Tax Collector.....



*The Over 65 Exemption only applies to the fall per capita.

*If your taxes are escrowed, it's your responsibility to notify your mortgage company. Bills will always be mailed to the homeowner and never to the mortgage company.

*My accepted forms of payment are cash, check (until December 11th), money order, cashier check and debit/credit cards (<u>www.allpaid.com</u>)

*I enclose per capita bills with real estate bills, please open your envelopes even if your real estate taxes are paid with escrow.

*I do not have office hours. Please call ahead and make sure I'll be around at the time you want to show up.

*If you receive a per capita bill for someone who doesn't live there/deceased etc. Mark the bill with the appropriate reason and return it to me to remove them from my list.

*You still pay per capita even if you rent. Its not your landlord's responsibility to pay it. It's not a new tax, if you're just receiving it, it means I found you, not that it's something new.





Deck the Bikes 2024

Yes, soon it will be time to start thinking about your entry for the 2024 Deck the Bikes competition! Last year's event was a resounding success considering it was Wrightsville's first ever. We had 11 entries, some of which were sponsored by local businesses and others by local artists. The entries could be categorized as Artistic, Clever or Funny, or by their Trail-Town theme.



In 2024, we plan for bigger and better prizes to attract more entries. Our first place winner in 2023, Jes Zelner, will be on a caffeine rush for quiet a while with her \$100 gift card to the Trail-Town business, Coffee and Cream in Columbia, PA. Her bike is preserved in the Boro building with the town's Christmas decorations so we can showcase it for 2024's event.

The second-place winner, Alicia Ferrari, donated her bike to Common Wheels in Lancaster, PA . They decided to display in the storefront window for the 2024 Christmas season. If you don't know about Common Wheels yet, an introduction from their website sums it up: "Inspired by our passion for bikes and the community we call home, we've built our organization to have a maximum impact in transforming lives through bikes." Of the 11 entries in Deck the Bikes 2023, 9 of them were donated by the owners to Common Wheels after the competition.

In 2024, we plan to notify the local high schools about the event early in the summer; and invite their art and technical school departments to create entries for Deck the Bikes as a class project. Since so many businesses were interested in sponsoring entries in 2023, we plan to expand that program for 2024.

Deck the Bikes 2024 will accept entries that are full bikes decked out for the holidays or in a Trail Town theme, as well as bike parts that have been assembled into artwork. The second and third place prizes in the 2023 competition, awarded to Alicia Ferrari and Home Goodies in Columbia, were an example of bike-parts artwork. Both were wreaths made from the wheels of a bike that was pulled from the Susquehanna River.

SAFETY REMINDERS

- Fill the tanks of lawn mowers, motorbikes and power saws only when the motor is cool and not when in an enclosed area
- Store gasoline in an approved safety can and in a cool area away from the house in a detached garage or shed
- Dispose of old cans of paint, paint thinners, and accumulated newspapers in the proper manner
- Change the batteries in all detectors (smoke & carbon monoxide) every year. The actual detector (smoke & carbon monoxide) should be replaced every 10 years
- Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to ensure they are working properly
- Conduct a family fire drill. Review and practice your family escape plan
- Barbeque gas grills (including gas hoses) and propane tanks should be inspected before use
- Fire is NOT the way to get rid of yard waste. The burning of leaves and any general yard waste is not permitted within the Borough of Wrightsville.

ADOPT-A-STORM DRAIN

It is very important that we work together to keep our storm drains working at 100% capacity at all times. Leaves, grass clippings, trash, branches, etc. can cause blockage which may result in dangerous street flooding if a storm hits

Please report any damaged or blocked storm drain inlets right away by calling the Water Department at 717-252-3711

THE EFFECTS OF POLLUTION

Polluted stormwater runoff can have many adverse effects on plants, fish, animals and people.

- *Sediment* can cloud the water and make it difficult or impossible for aquatic plants to grow. Sediment also can destroy aquatic habitats.
- *Excess nutrients* can cause algae blooms When algae die, they sink to the bottom and decompose in a process that removes oxygen from the water. Fish and other aquatic organisms can't exist in water with low dissolved oxygen levels.
- **Bacteria and other pathogens** can wash into swimming areas and create health hazards, often making beach closures necessary.
- *Debris* plastic bags, six-pack rings, bottles, and cigarette butts that are washed into water bodies can choke, suffocate, or disable aquatic life like ducks, fish, turtles and birds.
- *Household hazardous wastes* like insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, used motor oil, and other auto fluids can poison aquatic life.

ZONING AND BUILDING PERMITS

All Zoning and Building permit paperwork is processed at the Borough office. Payment for both will also be collected at the Borough. If your project requires both a Zoning and Building Permit you will need to pay for each permit separately. Permit fees do not need to be paid until permit is approved and picked up.

DO I NEED A PERMIT?

It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, move, improve, remove, convert or demolish any building/structure without a permit.

NO WORK CAN BE STARTED UNLESS PERMIT IS ISSUED FROM BOROUGH OFFICE!!

PROOF OF INSURANCE

Proof of Insurance is required on all projects in the form of a **Certificate of Liability** listing **Wrightsville Borough** as the **certificate holder.** If a contractor is doing the work, their liability insurance information is required. If a contractor is not employed, the homeowner must provide a copy of their homeowners insurance in the form of a certificate of liability. This is typically called an ACORD file.

- The Stormwater Fees will be included in the upcoming Water, Sewer and Refuse bill.
- The charge will be based on the ERU (Equivalent Residential Unit) yearly fee which will be divided into monthly installments.
- Customers with empty parcels, parking lots or cemeteries will be sent a separate annual bill for the full amount due with a due date to be determined.
- Customers with a past due stormwater bill will be turned into collections.
